# **Uniform Policy**

At Tarbiyyah Secondary School we are proud to have simple rules when it comes to student uniforms.

Please note the following uniform items. All in **Red** are all mandatory:

- **Black Blazer** (purchased from Tesco's/Asda/M&S or similar)
- Black V-neck jumper (purchased from Tesco's/Asda/M&S or similar)
- **School badges** (Purchased from the school)
- **Plain White Thawbs with collars and without pattern** - (purchased online)
- **Black plain leather shoes**
- **Black socks**
- Navy blue sweatshirt for PE (TBC - purchased from the school)
- Navy blue track-suit bottoms for PE (TBC - purchased from the school)
- Suitable trainers for PE
- ALL undergarments must be above their ankles. If their trousers fall below their ankles, then it must be tucked into their socks, not folded.
- Hair must be of equal length (no skin fades or low tapers)
- Plain school bag suitable to hold A4 books separate water bottle and lunch holder

## **Tarbiyyah Secondary Three Strikes Rule:**

Tarbiyyah Secondary operates a 'three strike' procedure and to ensure that sanctions are minimised. If a student receives a C3 for a particular sanction then a 45 minute detention is served the next day along with a text message sent to parent. This may also involve regular counselling sessions that are documented depending on the reason for sanction.

If the same sanction is repeated three times within a term then on the third occasion then this is then logged as a concern. A parent is requested to come in with the pupil to discuss reasons as to why the pupil has repeated this sanction and suggestions/strategies to overcome this problem are set. A child cannot enter the classroom after the third time until a parent accompanies them. Once a meeting has been held the following day then the pupil will go to class and serve their third detention at the end of the day. If this persists again within the term then parent will be called straightaway and further methods discussed.

Footwear is deemed to be unacceptable if it is any colour other than plain black, overly decorative or without flat heels. Trainers, boots, pumps or canvas shoes are not permitted. Sports brands such as Vans, Converse, Nike and Adidas are not permitted.
